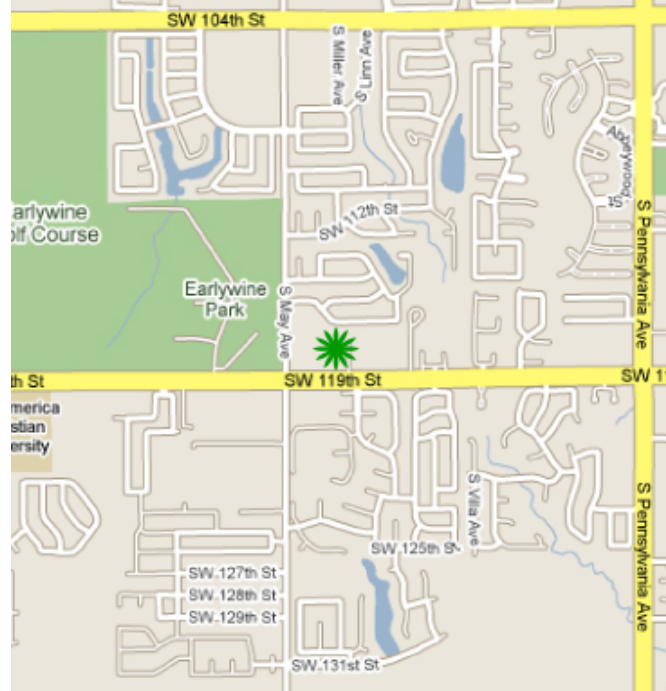

# Blessed Beginnings Preschool

Blessed Beginnings Preschool's mission is to make early disciples of Jesus Christ by encouraging the spiritual, academic, social, and physical development of each child in the framework of God's love. Our goal is to provide children with a well rounded education of Christian values, Biblical teaching and academic excellence. ## DAYS AND HOURS OF OPERATION

Blessed Beginnings Preschool has a two-day (Tues/Fri) and a three-day (Tues/Wed/Fri) Preschool program for children ages two through five. School hours are 9:30am-2:30pm. School begins the Friday after Labor Day in September and ends in May. The calendar will follow Moore Public Schools.

## ENROLLMENT

Blessed Beginnings open enrollment begins in March. Due to limited class size, enrollment will be on a first come first serve basis. There is a \$40 non-refundable enrollment fee for each child. Children must turn two before September 1, to enroll. An enrollment form and tuition agreement must be completed at the time of enrollment. A current copy of each child's immunization record is also required.

## TUITION

Monthly tuition for Blessed Beginnings is \$130 for the two-day program and \$175 for the three-day program. This amount is due the first school day of each month, beginning in September and ending in May.

## DAILY ACTIVITIES AND CURRICULUM

Each day children will participate in a variety of teacher planned and child initiated activities. The curriculum is theme based and includes: music, learning centers, Bible stories, sign language, outdoor play, arts and crafts, and physical fitness. Lessons will include numbers, letters, colors, shapes and a variety of other academic skills. Our three and four year olds will be taught manuscript writing style.

Children will also attend chapel. During this time, students come together to sing songs and recite pledges to the American and Christian flag. They also hear a short Bible story and recite the Lord's prayer.

Children are asked to pack a lunch each day. Children also take turns bringing a healthy snack to share with the class on a rotating schedule.

## SPECIAL EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

Each class will have two parties throughout the year, one in the Fall and one in the Spring. The children will also put on two programs, a Christmas and Spring program. The preschool also enjoys sharing with parents in two parent/teacher conferences a year.

# Discipleworld Children's Ministries

## SUNDAY SCHOOL

Currently there are two Sunday School hours, 9:30am and 10:50am. Classes involve music, storytime, scripture and discussions.

## TODDLER TIME

Toddler Time is for all children ages birth-kindergarten along with their parents, grandparents, and/or caregivers. Toddler Time meets twice a month- once at St. Andrew's for storytime and crafts and then again for a special event or fieldtrip.

## EXPLORE 34

Explore 34 is our ministry especially for 3rd-4th grade boys and girls. Explore 34 meets once a quarter to "explore" God's world and learn more about his love for them.

## CLUB 56

Club 56 is our ministry designed for 5th-6th grade boys and girls. Club 56 meets once a month for a fun activity or a mission opportunity. There are also special small group Bible studies throughout the year focusing on subjects for their age group.

## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Vacation Bible School is a mid-summer, week-long program that is always a highlight for the Children's Ministry. During VBS 2009, we'll explore Crocodile Dock, where fearless kids shine God's light! The kids will learn great Bible lessons, sing fun songs, experience cool dramas and eat delicious snacks. It's an experience you won't want to miss!

## SUMMER CAMPS

Each year children entering 1st-6th grades have the opportunity to attend Summer Camp at one of our United Methodist campgrounds. ### UNITED METHODIST MEN

Men of St. Andrew's have a large, active ministry with many enriching opportunities. There is a Men's Bible Study every Wednesday morning at 6:30am in the Fellowship Hall. Donuts and coffee are served and lively fellowship and discussions always abound. On the third Saturday of each month, the Men's Fellowship gathers for breakfast in 8:00am in the Christian Life Center. In addition to sharing breakfast and a message of encouragement, the men often work together on service or mission projects in the church or throughout the community. The UMM also hosts special events throughout the year like their annual Golf Tournament, a Valentine's Dinner and much more!

### GIRLFRIENDS UNITED

St. Andrew's women have many opportunities to be involved. There are a number of Bible studies offered that vary in length and focus. Some are offered during the day and others are offered during the evenings. Most studies are at the church and provide nursery at no cost. All the Bible study groups provide fellowship and growth, fun and enrichment. The women also go on a 2-day retreat, usually in February at a Methodist Camp, where there is a guest speaker, food, fun, and an opportunity for spiritual renewal. The women host several annual events such as the Spring brunch, the Fall Plant Sale, and the Christmas Tea or Holiday Tasting. They are also involved in various missions like Exodus House, Student Scholarships, providing Bibles for the Juvenile Detention Center, and many more!

## Special Adult Small Group Ministries

The means by which we help people to mature in their faith and become better Disciples of Christ is through small group ministry. Small group ministry is evident in the New Testament as well as a part of our United Methodist heritage, when John Wesley organized the early Methodists into classes. At St. Andrews we encourage every member to be a part of a small group whether it is on Sunday mornings or one of our other small group offerings. Our main small group emphasis is on Disciple Bible study. These groups begin in mid August and run in conjunction with the school year, ending in May. Disciple classes one through four, Christian Believer and Jesus in The Gospels comprise a well balanced, informative way to learn more about the Bible and at the same time be in fellowship with others who help us grow stronger in faith. Throughout the year we offer other short term Bible study classes such as Alpha and several women's Bible study groups and a men's morning group where those who don't have the chance to start Disciple can also be in small group. ## VOCAL MINISTRIES

The **Worship Choir** meets on Wednesday evenings. The choir is an extension of the worship leaders, all pointing to Christ through song! They minister through a variety of styles, from "praise and worship" to "gospel" and "jazz and classics". During the Easter and Christmas seasons, the choir expands to greater numbers as we prepare concerts or musical dramas to share with the community.

From time to time, we hear great harmonies of diverse styles from the **Mens' Ensemble** and the **Ladies' Ensemble**. Other ensembles and soloists prepare music for Sunday worship, variety shows, banquets and other church activities.

We have multiple **Worship Vocal Teams** that join the Worship Band to lead Sunday morning worship once a month at a time. The Team is made up of specially selected singers, youth and adult, who love the Lord and have voices that lead.

## INSTRUMENTAL MINISTRIES

The Worship Band meets on Wednesday evenings to prepare for Sunday worship. Most of these players are experienced musicians.

The **Worship Orchestra** is made up of the Worship Band plus brass, wind and string instruments for the Worship Orchestra must have had at least two years experience. The Orchestra plays every 2nd Sunday of the month plus special celebration times like Easter and Christmas.

The **Hand-Bell Ministry** has two adult teams and two children's teams which meet once a week to prepare for worship. Whether you are able to read music or not, we will teach you! This ministry calls for a strong time commitment because each individual plays an integral role in achieving a group sound.

## DRAMA MINISTRY

Drama teams of all ages prepare scripts to enhance worship and provide insight into Christian living. St. Andrew's produces musical dramas throughout the year where all the creative gifts are given opportunity to be expressed. Areas of ministry include writing, directing, acting, sewing, painting, and more!

## DANCE MINISTRY

Liturgical dancers of all ages perform from time to time at St. Andrew's. Through this ministry, we hope to teach the principles and use of liturgical dance in worship through a variety of styles. This special ministry is a way to allow those who have a heart and gift for dance and movement to use their gifts in honor and praise to the Lord!

## KIDS IN MINISTRY

**"Kids in Ministry"** is a Sunday evening Fine Arts Program that includes music, drama, dance, games, food, fellowship and ministry! The K.I.M. program is made up of Elementary students, grades 1-6, and is led by Directors Ginny Pass and Susan Morris. The children produce a Christmas musical drama which is usually performed on the first Sunday evening in December. The kids learn motions and dance under the instruction of Angie Martin. The kids learn songs which are also sung at Sunday morning worship services and area nursing homes, so that they can use their gifts in the Church as well as outside the walls in ministry.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL WORSHIP

Preschoolers and Elementary kids meet weekly during the Sunday School hour with David Carr to worship Christ through song. These children then have the opportunity to sing these songs in special worship services throughout the year.

## PRIVATE INSTRUCTION

### STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry is a program of our congregation that equips lay people to provide distinctively Christian, one-to-one care to those who are experiencing all kinds of life needs and circumstances, both in our congregation, and in our community. Training classes to become a Stephen Minister are given throughout the year.

### PRAYER CHAIN MINISTRY

You can become a member of an organized prayer chain to respond in prayer whenever a need arises.

### MEAL ASSIST MINISTRY

This ministry provides meals to families and individuals when circumstances warrant, usually after returning home from a hospital stay or after a death in the family.

### NOTE WRITING MINISTRY

Utilizing pre-printed stationary, members of this ministry write notes for all occasions to persons within and outside our church.

### COMMUNION OUTREACH MINISTRY

Members of this ministry provide communion elements to homebound members as needed.

### COOKIE BAKER MINISTRY

This ministry shows care and concern through the gift of "home-made" cookies, either delivered to the church and distributed from there, or delivered directly to a home.

## Missions and Outreach

St. Andrew's people are actively involved in missions throughout the Oklahoma City community and the world. We consider this as our "Go" ministry from our mission statement to "Know, Grow and Go In Christ Jesus." As United Methodists we are connected to missions through our "apportionment" giving that goes to UM missions such as Circle of Care, and CJAMM prison ministry, as well as Skyline Urban ministry. In addition, we also have missions outside of this connection that include working with Grace Fellowship, feeding the homeless, and medical missions to Africa and Mexico. Below is a list of team members who represent various missions for St. Andrew's. We strongly encourage members to involve themselves in mission as we believe that it is a Biblical mandate to help the poor and bring the "Good News" of Jesus Christ.

**Missions and Outreach Coordinator: Margaret Robertson**

**Blood Drive: Debbie Meyers and Terri Walker**

St. Andrew's becomes a mobile site for a blood drive in conjunction with the Oklahoma Blood Institute. St. Andrew's hosts several blood drives per year.

**Christmas Missions: Bill Lester**

Each year at Christmas time, St. Andrew's participates in various missions to provide Christmas goodies for needy individuals and families. St. Andrew's has been involved with Skyline Ministry, Grace Fellowship, Santa's Cause and Samaritan's Purse.

**Circle of Care: Don Bowen**

Circle of Care is a not-for-profit agency whose mission is to provide help, healing, and wholeness to children, youth, and families who are hurting or are in need. They serve the children and families from across Oklahoma with a Children's Home in Tahlequah, a Boy's Ranch in Gore, the Holsinger Home in Enid, the Frances E. Willard Ministry Center in Tulsa, and the Child S.H.A.R.E. foster and adoptive program currently serving the Greater Oklahoma City and Tulsa Areas.

**Criminal Justice and Mercy Ministries (CJAMM): Lesa Stiger**

CJAMM is the prison ministry of the Oklahoma Conference of the United Methodist Church providing opportunities for Christian outreach to incarcerated people and ex-offenders and their families. CJAMM brings wholeness to individuals and families through the following ministries: Redemption Church, Exodus House, Angel Tree, New Day Camp, Kairos, John Wesley Charter School, and the Juvenile Facilities Programs.

**Habitat for Humanity**

St. Andrew's schedules work dates with the Central Oklahoma Habitat for Humanity chapter to help build simple, decent, affordable housing, and to provide hope for responsible, hard-working, limited income families living in substandard condition.

**Leadership for Life (formerly Medics, Intl): Bill Lester**

Although not an official mission project of the UMC, Bill Lester, a member of St. Andrew's is a full time missionary at Leadership for Life. Bill journeys to Africa and has many interesting and amazing true stories he can relate about his travels. Bill is always interested in having you and your group accompany him on one of his trips.

**Project Transformation and Kelley Elementary Tutors: Gwyn Day**

St. Andrew's is involved in Project Transformation after-school and summer program at Hillcrest United Methodist Church. It is a ministry which helps elementary school age children with their homework and with reading.

**Skyline Ministries Alive on Saturday Night: Paula McAdams**

Alive on Saturday Night meets every Saturday at 6:30pm for a worship service in the church located at 701 NW 8th Street. After the service, visiting churches provide a hot meal for the areas congregation. St. Andrew's usually provides the meal twice a year.

**Skyline Ministries McKee Center: Dana Old/ Cheryl Case**

St. Andrew's regularly provides donations for the Skyline McKee Center clothes closet. There is a drop off spot at the church for your donations of clothing, household items, non-perishable food items, toys, linens, etc. The McKee Center also provides lunch and activities for local senior citizens on a fixed income. Lunches are donated by are United Methodist Churches, St. Andrew's being one of them.

**Volunteers in Mission:**

St. Andrew's joins Volunteers in Mission and takes a Medical Mission to Rio Bravo, Mexico, every year. Those with medical experience and those without are welcome to attend. There is also a need for Construction Missions where you have the opportunity to build small houses, improve church facilities, or assist in the rebuilding efforts devastated by natural disasters. International Mission tasks include construction, Mission Bible schools, medical, educational, and HIV/AIDS outreach. You can expect a great welcome and deep appreciation by serving in any of these areas.

## What We Believe

As United Methodists, we have an obligation to bear a faithful Christian witness to Jesus Christ, the living reality at the center of the Church's life and witness. To fulfill this obligation, we reflect critically on our biblical and theological inheritance, striving to express faithfully the witness we make in our own time. Two considerations are central to this endeavor: the sources from which we derive our theological affirmations and the criteria by which we assess the adequacy of our understanding and witness. Wesley believed that the living core of the Christian faith was revealed in Scripture, illumined by tradition, vivified in personal experience, and confirmed by reason.

**Doctrinal Standards and Our Theological Task**

United Methodists profess the historic Christian faith in God, incarnate in Jesus Christ for our salvation and ever at work in human history in the Holy Spirit. Living in a covenant of grace under the Lordship of Jesus Christ, we participate in the first fruits of God's coming reign and pray in hope for its full realization on earth as in heaven.

**The Ministry of All Christians**

The mission of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Local churches provide the most significant arena through which disciple-making occurs. Every believer in Christ is a minister.

**Social Principles**

The United Methodist Church has a long history of concern for social justice. Its members have often taken forthright positions on concerns.

# A Brief History of the United Methodist Church

On April 23, 1968, The United Methodist Church was created when Bishop Reuben H. Mueller, representing The Evangelical United Brethren Church, and Bishop Lloyd C. Wicke of The Methodist Church joined hands at the constituting General Conference in Dallas, Texas. With the words, "Lord of the Church, we are united in Thee, in Thy Church and now in The United Methodist Church," the new denomination was given birth by two churches that had distinguished histories and influential ministries in various parts of the world. Theological traditions steeped in the Protestant Reformation and Wesleyanism, similar ecclesiastical structures, and relationships that dated back almost two hundred years facilitated the union. In the Evangelical United Brethren heritage, for example, Philip William Otterbein, the principal founder of the United Brethren in Christ, assisted in the ordination of Francis Asbury to the superintendency of American Methodist work. Jacob Albright, through whose religious experience and leadership the Evangelical Association was begun, was nurtured in a Methodist class meeting following his conversion.

## Facility Use/Rental

The facilities at St. Andrew's can be used and/or rented for Weddings, Baptisms, Funerals, Celebrations, Meetings, Banquets, Sports Activities, etc. The Worship Center can accommodate approximately 600 people and our Christian Life Center can accommodate approximately 800 people. The Christian Life Center has two full basketball courts and both buildings have a full kitchen. St. Andrew's also has many small and large classrooms which can be used for more private functions.
