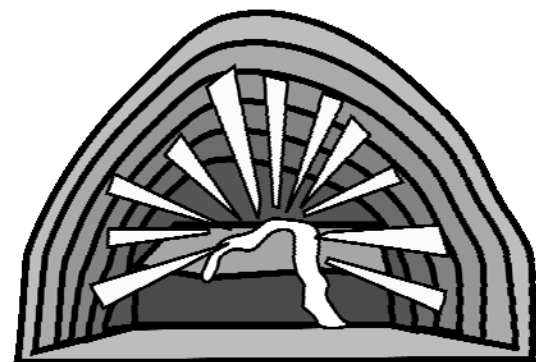

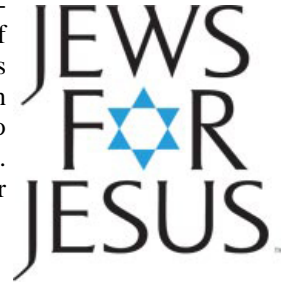

Share Fest

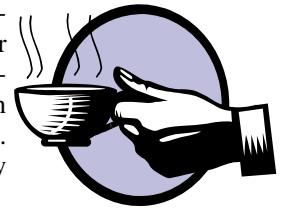


ShareFest is an annual event created to highlight and celebrate the ways our faith community touches the needs of our city. On Saturday, April 17, St. Andrew's will select a project

Redemption Kids

Redemption Kids is a program that helps children (ages 6 to 17) that have an incarcerated parent lead their lives in a positive direction with the strength and knowledge of Jesus Christ. WHEN DISASTER STRIKES...

What do you do when your heart tells you that it is time to donate to help people who have been struck by disaster and you have limited funds? Where is the place to put your funds that will give the most help and who will be the best steward of Gods money? A member of our church has helped in disasters across our country for many years and it is his opinion that there are several national organizations that do it well. One organization arrives to feed workers and victims. Another arrives to start housing the victims. Still another gives aid to both of these organizations. The one organization that stays in the community well after the news media leaves and the excitement is over is UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). Giving to any nationally respected organization is a great thing to do. But UMCOR is United Methodism in action. UMCOR's administrative costs are funded through our conference so that 100% of disaster donations go to the disaster you desire to help.
