DISCIPLE

Disciple Classes

It's time to start thinking about Disciple! Disciple is an intensive Bible study designed to help participants become better disciples of Christ. It is Bible study aimed at transformation, not just information. Our classes will begin the week of August 22. We hope to have classes on Monday and Wednesday nights. Please sign up early so we can get the classes assigned properly. Contact David Johnson at 692-4242, ext. 105 for more information.

Disciple I - Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study

An overview of the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. One sees the "Big Picture" of how the Bible fits together and reads over 70% of the Bible during this time. This study is a prerequisite for all other Disciple courses.

Disciple II - Into the Word, Into the World

A concentrated study of Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts. This class gives a clear sense of the beginnings of God's relationship to His people and the beginnings of the Christian church which was formed from the new covenant established by Jesus.

Disciple III - Remember Who You Are

A study of the Old Testament prophets and the writings of the Apostle Paul. This class explores the words of God to His people as they prepared for the coming Messiah and Paul's words to the new churches that link the Old Testament teachings with the teachings of Jesus for the church today.

Disciple IV - Under the Tree of Life

The writings of the Old Testament are studied, along with the writings of John, James, and Jude in the New Testament. The study of Revelation shows the long-suffering love of God and the extravagant climax of the message and the promise.

Christian Believer - Knowing GOD with Heart and Mind

A study presenting, explaining and interpreting church doctrine. Looks at appropriate scriptures in both the Old and New Testaments.

Jesus in the Gospels

Invites believers to look at Jesus in each of the four Gospels and ask the question, "Who is the Jesus that you see?" This study will deepen discipleship through better understanding of the biblical texts and their message.

This year St. Andrew’s was a bamboo forest for about 69 preschoolers, 275 Kindergarten through 5th graders, and 20 6th graders. A total of about 374 kids were served a great big helping of Jesus! THANK YOU to everyone who had a hand in the success of VBS 2011!

The missions this year were put into practice by our sixth graders.

Every day they went out and did what the rest of the kids raised money for. Monday a speaker from Oklahoma City Beautiful came to give the sixth graders a presentation on littering and what OKCB does about it. They were given packets by OKCB and cleaned up Merrell Medley Park on 104th and Penn.

Tuesday the kids brought in their coins. 3,607 pennies, 579 nickels, 708 dimes, 419 quarters, 4 dollar coins, 21 dollar bills and 1 ten dollar bill (\$275.57) went to Waves for Water. WFW is a foundation that gives a clean water solution to communities that have none. One ceramic (family) filter can help 14 people have clean water per day for over a year (as long as they take care of the filter). One membrane (community) filter can help 100 people indefinitely (as long as they take care of the filter). We raised enough money to purchase 6 membrane filters.

Since our sixth graders could not take the money directly to the organization or deliver a filter personally, they stuck with the theme of “water keeps people healthy” and handed out cold bottles of water to the runners/walkers/maintenance men of Earlywine Park and YMCA. They also had some kits left over from the day before with OKCB and decided to beautify Earlywine by picking up trash there as well.

On Wednesday, pacifiers, baby wipes, bottles, sippy cups, onesies, diapers, blankets, formula, diaper cream, baby lotion and baby shampoo galore filled our mission baskets! The sixth graders immediately took these donations and carried them in to Infant Crisis Center on NE 42nd and Lincoln. They got a tour of the facilities and learned what the organization attempts to accomplish each year. Some have already made plans to go back to volun...uhrrr, minister there.

Thursday brought pencils, erasers, markers, map pencils, loose leaf paper, folders, glue sticks and crayons to our mission baskets. The sixth graders stuffed 25 backpacks full of the donations. They carried those backpacks to Apple Creek Elementary, a Title 1 School, in Moore district (where St. Andrew’s fabulous Shelley McMillin is principal). Shelley met them there, gave them a tour of the school, which was under construction, and they were rewarded for a four day adventure of missions with Icees from 7-11. But the best was yet to come!

Friday, St. Andrew’s Vacation Bible School brought in peanut butter, canned meat, canned green peas, and powdered milk. Fourteen of the finest sixth graders in Oklahoma City took our donations to Skyline Urban Ministries on 8th street. Our “Boomer” group got to take a tour of the beautiful church and the facility as if they were a family in need (with their laminated check-out card). Half of the group then sorted beans and rice into 200 quart size ziplocks while the other half prepared “double-bagging” so the people that benefit from Skyline’s ministry can carry their goods with ease.

She doesn't speak English and uses Google Translate to tell us of their appreciation. The missions team thought it would be better for you to read it in her words. They plan to use our donation to buy uniforms for the girls to wear to school. In Mexico, children cannot attend school without a uniform. Our donation also provides them with one meal a day. At this time there are 28 girls at Don Bosco ranging in age from 5 to 17 years old.

The photos are compliments of the Cruz family. They are missionaries St. Andrew's sends some support to as they try to build a church in San Miguel de Allende. They visit the casas hogares (orphanages) of Don Bosco and Santa Julia on Sunday afternoons to teach bible stories and sing songs. As he tells in his note, this new contact with the girls is a blessing to his family also.

To St. Andrew's -

This I want to thank your support by donating \$1,500 (one thousand invaluable five hundred dollars) to the Casa Hogar, because for us your feedback is through to this institution.
