We need all junior high girls and older to participate to make our goal possible. We are asking for donations because buying in bulk allows us to buy the fleece at a lower cost. If you would like to bring your own fleece fabric, please do so. Before we give these blankets and pillows away we would like to give the church an opportunity to pray over each blanket and pillow. Please make plans to attend this wonderful mission project. Mark your calendars for the other 2012 dates: January 14, April 7, and July 28. Our first set of blankets will be delivered to OU Cancer Center.

## Elizabeth Leaving Santa Julia

Elizabeth came to Santa Julia in 2005 after having her mother



pour liquor on her face and chest and set her on fire. The badly disfigured little ten year old girl was placed by the social services agency of Mexico at Santa Julia and has since received many skin grafts. The frightened, shy, withdrawn child who is now 16, has bloomed in these years both inside and out. She is a B student; likes English, violin, computer, soccer, and reading. Because of her maturity, she is one of the girl representatives on the advisory council and has been termed "an old soul," wise beyond her years, calm, and sweet.

Three years ago a couple and their four children from Dallas visited Santa Julia and decided to sponsor Elizabeth in English class in San Miguel. Their love for her grew and the family wanted to adopt her. It has been three years of red tape but Elizabeth will soon be leaving Santa Julia to go home to live with her new family in Dallas. She will be home schooled the first semester she is there to get her up to speed in English so that she can attend high school.

Although Elizabeth has more medical procedures and other challenges yet to come, let's give praise to God for bringing her out of a horrible life into a progressively better one with a promising future.
