2023 Lenten Study - The Gospel of John

"I have loved you even as the Father has loved me. Remain in my love." John 15:9

Our word for 2023 is **REMAIN**. With all the changes we have experienced the last few years, it is important to remember our call to **REMAIN** in Jesus. One way we do that is by remaining in **PRAYER** and **GOD'S WORD**.

Lent is a season of **REPENTANCE**, **PRAYER** and **PREPARATION**. As we journey towards Easter, we will be praying and reading through the Gospel of John together. As you read through the Gospel of John during the week, we will be taking a closer look at John 15 on Sunday mornings in worship. This is the chapter of John where Jesus calls us to **REMAIN** in Him and in His love. Our hope and prayer is that our faith will be strengthened during this season of Lent as we read through the Gospel of John and focus on **REMAINING** in Him.

This booklet provides a guide for **DAILY READINGS** and a chance to do some **PERSONAL REFLECTION** each day. Perhaps you will want to journal your thoughts in the spaces provided. Or perhaps you will simply want to give it mental, prayerful mediation. Either way you choose can be beneficial to your discipleship.

Gospel of John Background

John was a fisherman and was fishing on the day he first met Jesus. In that life-changing encounter, John believed something about Jesus that compelled him to leave everything to follow Him. Along with his brother, James, and Simon Peter, John became part of Jesus' **INNER CIRCLE OF DISCIPLES** who witnessed some of the most significant events in the life of Jesus.

The Gospel of John emphasizes Jesus as God incarnate and in the opening chapter states that Jesus was with God at creation and that **JESUS IS GOD**. John spends the rest of his Gospel account emphasizing Jesus' identity as God in human form.

John wrote to strengthen the faith of Christians who were experiencing **DOUBT**, **DISCOURAGEMENT** and **DISBELIEF**. He states in John 20:31 that "these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name."

Four prayers for us to lift up as we take this journey together

Pray for a clear word from God about Jesus

 Invite the Holy Spirit to open our minds, eyes and hearts to understanding the nature of Jesus through His Word. We want to see Jesus.

Pray for people to be ready to hear

We meet people in John who are not ready to hear, so they miss
Jesus who is standing right in front of them and speaking to
them. We meet others who are ready to hear and they respond
to Him in faith. We want to be those who hear and believe.

• Pray for St. Andrew's to remain in His love

 Jesus has saved us and His love for us awakens our love for Him.
 But we can become distracted, discouraged and distanced from Jesus. Let's ask God to reawaken our hearts. We want to love Jesus.

• Pray for people to make the decision to follow Jesus

• We can't assume that everyone who comes to St. Andrew's is a follower of Jesus already. Some possibly have yet to be awakened to the grace of God and to faith in Jesus. The gospel and the power of the Holy Spirit lead people to believe and follow Jesus. We want to see people place their faith in Jesus and follow Him.

•	How does Jesus use the crowd's need for food as an opportunity to teach His disciples about His divine identity (see especially v6)?
•	What is the significance of Jesus saving "It is I" or "I am" in verse 20?

 What do we learn about God from this pas 	sage?
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 In verse 35, Jesus says whoever comes to me will never go hungry and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. What does Jesus mean by this? What might this mean for you personally?

• Jesus makes a bold statement in verse 47, "Whoever belongs to God hears what God says. The reason you do not hear is you do not belong to God." Based on how closely you listen to God can you honestly say that you belong to him?

Monday, March 13 / John 9:1-41

•	The blind man dealt with a lot of shame because of his condition, and Jesus
	healed him from it. Take time to reflect on shame Jesus has healed you from
	in the past, or shame you know He wants to heal you from today.

• Have you ever had a "I was blind, but now I see" moment where Jesus radically saved or transformed you? Thank God for that moment, or take this opportunity to invite Him to do it for the first time.

• Like the Pharisees, many people deny Jesus no matter what evidence they see. Do you have anyone like that in your life? Take time to pray for an opportunity to share God's love with them this week so that they might finally see Jesus.

Tuesday, March 14 / John 10:1-21

 How has Jesus helped you experience "life to the full" or "a rich and satisfying life (v10)?

• Jesus says, "I am the good shepherd" and He willingly gave his life for His sheep. What part of the good shepherd description amazes and connects with you the most?

• In what ways do you need to experience and know Jesus as the Good Shepherd today?

Wednesday, March 15 / John 10:22-42

•	Do Jesus' works that we read about in the Gospel of John lead you to believe
	He is God? Why or why not?

• CS Lewis says, "There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, "Thy will be done," and those to whom God says in the end, "Thy will be done." Reflecting on your life and actions, which person are you? Do you humble yourself before God and pray for His will to be done in your life or do you take matters into your own hands and command God to surrender to your will?

Thursday, March 16 / John 11:1-27

• Have you ever felt like God didn't' do something in your timing, but ultimately saw the good of His timing?

• What impact might it have on your life today to know you will live forever with Jesus?

• Jesus says, "I am the life." In what ways are you experiencing the abundant life only available through Jesus?

 The Glory of God is a theme throughout John. Describe the glory of God in your own words.

•	In the United States we aren't persecuted for our faith like the first disciples. However, we still face opposition to following Jesus. Reflect on a time you faced opposition because of your love for Jesus.			
•	Are you currently avoiding opposition to your faith in order to be liked by people or to avoid difficult circumstances? If so, what steps do you need to take to be bolder in your faith?

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Why does Jesus say it is better for Him to go away than to stay on earth?

• The Spirit of Jesus will guide you into all truth. What are some of the most impactful truths the Spirit has guided you to?

Wednesday, March 29 / John 16:16-33

•	The disciples often struggled to understand what Jesus was trying to teach
	them. Reflect on a time you read scripture and didn't understand what Jesus
	was trying to teach you.

Jesus uses childbirth to explain how joy can cover the anguish of our past.
 Have you experienced this transformational experience a joyous moment can create?

• If so, praise God for that. If not, ask God to either provide something to be joyful for, or for you to experience a peace in Jesus that will redirect your perspective.

Thursday, March 30 / John 17:1-26

• Jesus prays for three things: Himself, His friends, and believers. In what ways can you pray for yourself?

In what ways can you pray for those close to you?

Friday, March 31 / John 18:1-24

•	Upon reading this scripture, It can be easy to declare our ability to act
	differently than Peter in that situation, but often times people withhold their
	faith from others. Have you ever not told the whole story to leave Jesus out
	of it?

 Do you act differently with your "church" friends than you do with your "work" friends? Denial can take many forms. Spend time in prayer asking God to increase your awareness and for the boldness to declare and share your faith when the time comes.

Saturday, April 1 / John 18:25-40

• There comes a time when people have the power to do what is right, despite opposition or peer pressure. Who is in your circle of influence? Who relies or looks up to you?

 Often times, what God calls us to do will appear opposite to what everyone else thinks. Spend time in prayer asking God for the courage and boldness to do what is right.

Monday, April 3 / John 19:1-27

Jesus says in John 19:11 that people have no power over Him unless it is given to them. That means the only reason Jesus was beaten was because He let them. Reread John 19:1-3 and think about how every slap, whip, and attack was taken for you. It doesn't matter what you have done or will do, Jesus still allowed himself to be tortured if it meant bringing you closer to Him and His Father. How much must Jesus love you if He was willing to do that?

• Consider the cost your relationship had for Jesus. How might this be an encouragement and motivation for you to help with someone else's relationship with God?

Tuesday, April 4 / John 19:28-42

 Sometimes, you will experience things as you follow Jesus that may be hard to believe like the man in John 19:35. Your story will help others believe if you are brave and bold enough to share it. Who is around you that you can share your story with?

 Reflect on what parts of your story give glory to God and could help others believe?

Wednesday, April 5 / John 20:1-18

•	When Mary Magdalene realized it was Jesus she was speaking to, she cried
	out "Teacher!". What things has Jesus taught you during Lent and our time
	reading and praying through the Gospel of John?

• When you think of Jesus, what is the first thing that comes to mind? (Son, Healer, Creator, Savior, or something else)

Thursday, April 6 / John 20:19-30

• Thomas needed to see proof before he would believe. Are you someone that needs to see before believing? Is there anything you feel God still needs to prove to you before you give everything to Him?

• Identify your struggles, and ask God to work through those with you. He may give you the answer you have been looking for or He may change your heart or perspective on it.

•	God is in the business of abundantly rewarding obedience. The Disciples only
	caught those fish because they did exactly as Jesus told them. Reflect on your
	life. What areas can you be more obedient to God's commands?

• If unsure, are there things you can identify that take you farther away from God instead of closer?

• Spend time in prayer asking God for the self-awareness to find areas of growth and for the help to conquer it.

Saturday, April 8 / John 21:15-25

John 21:25 mentions the many other ways Jesus continued to impact people.
The living, resurrected Jesus is still impacting people through His church
today. How can the Holy Spirit work through you to better impact your
church? Your community?

• Spend time in prayer asking the Holy Spirit to equip you to contribute to both in a way that brings others closer to Jesus.
